PLATFORM STATEMENTS

A) Prabhatha Meduri- President

Hello,

I am Prabhatha Meduri, third year student of BA psychology. Here is my platform statement and the ideas of mine I am planning to execute after I become the President of Student union.

1. Advocate for Part-time job connections and free job-related trainings (first-aid & CPR)

My first priority focuses on employment as a two-step program. The university is already covering some areas of student employment, however I believe the Student Union can cover some of the areas that the university lacks, such as part-time employment for students and training programs. For example, CPR training costs around 135 dollars out of student's pockets. If we can get it to campus and be the connection between students and essential training, that means we are propelling students forward. The first step of the program would be lobbying with the university and outside organizations to bring training for students to be able to succeed when applying for jobs. With basic training of First Aid and CPR, Mental Health First Aid and Applied Suicide Prevention Training, students would be a step ahead of the competition without having to spend money out of their pockets. The second step of the program would be working together with the Marketing & Communications Manager to create a webpage on the SU website so that students would be able to look for part-time jobs directly through us. We want to be able to create meaningful connections with community employers to be able to showcase their positions available on our website.

2. Advocate for Peer-to-Peer support club

My second priority is related to mental health as a peer-to-peer support club. It will be solely a student-to-student initiative in which students will be able to share some of their similar interests and have someone to talk to when they feel lonely. The pandemic has made us all feel isolated from each other which has hindered our mental health. With this initiative I want to bring the sense of community back to campus. This group would meet twice a week and talk it out. With the information or opinions, I have received from students I understood that most of us are feeling isolated mentally and that we are not truly enjoying university life. Along with this initiative I am also going to work with VPSL and the mental health coordinator to organize several events, parties, and safe spaces for students to talk to and hangout with their peers.

3. Advocate for Free clothing donation program

During my consultations with different groups of students around campus, I have observed that many students feel insecure regarding clothing – especially winter clothing.

The price of clothes at thrift stores and regular stores have been steadily rising day by day. My idea is that we create a free clothing donation program, in which students would be able to donate clothes they don't wear as often and get other clothing items from their peers for free. I will establish a donation center on campus where students would be able to donate clothes they don't wear anymore. This program will be advertised in conjunction with the Marketing & Communications Manager so that we are able to spread the word around campus. That way, students will be able to spend less on clothing and still help their peers.

4. Advocate for Truth & Reconciliation

As we continue to recognize that the University of Prince Edward Island is seated on the land of the Mi'kma'ki nation, I stand to further assist in the decolonization and Indigenization of the Union. Decolonization and Indigenization would take the form of working with the Mawi'omi Center, the UPEISU Marketing & Communications Manager and the Indigenous students and professors to promote indigenous knowledge across campus. I will also strive to advocate, along with the VPAX, for a better and more inclusive budget for the center as it continues to support indigenous students through their years at UPEI.

Firstly, mental health. Mental health is poor among many people worldwide, especially students. In terms of advocacy, I would ensure mental health is at the forefront of all lobby discussions with all levels of government. Currently, the UPEISU uses Aspiria to provide mental health resources to students. In the past couple of years, it has been proven that Aspiria is not sufficient to adequately meet the needs of UPEI students. If elected, I would terminate the Student Union's contract with Aspiria and provide students with a more effective service. To further deepen the resources on campus, I would work closely with the UPEI administration to hire a BIPOC Counsellor, which we don't currently have yet and is much needed.

Secondly, I want to create a more affordable housing environment at UPEI. Along with mental health, housing would be at the forefront of all lobby meetings to force the government's hand in keeping its promise of making housing more affordable for students.

Thirdly, I want to improve the services and supports offered to international students. The current population of international students that make up the total student body is approximately 30%, and this number is ever-growing. I believe that the UPEI Student Union should make the necessary changes to better reflect the needs of these students. If elected, I would work closely with the International Student Office and BIPOC-UHSR to combine budgets and resources to host more effective services and events. I would also work to bring in the Atlantic Student Development Alliance on a contract with the SU to provide international students with their services free of charge.

Next, I want to restore the Student Union's credibility through rebuilding relationships with stakeholders, the university, and most importantly, students. I would revise the current office structure at the UPEISU, including creating more student jobs within the Union to ensure that the SU is working as effectively as possible.

Finally, if elected, other focus areas include advocating to the administration to adjust parking and athletic fees to better suit the needs of students, lobbying the government to increase funding to the Mawi'omi Center, and more advocacy at all levels of the government to ensure that UPEI students are better heard.
