We worry about rejection and worry that those we don't know may hurt us, or dislike us,


but the exact opposite is more likely. To cut ourselves off like islands is only furthering our longing for connection. Yet we will never know until we take the small leap and talk to a

so who do you go to now that your home has been snatched away?


